

RCMP Report

Baddeck

On July 20th, 2010, at approximately 9:15 pm, the Baddeck Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police responded to a motor vehicle collision involving a 13 year old male in the First Nation community of Wagmatcook.

The young man and two others were attempting to cross the 105 Highway near the Ultramar gas station. Two of the young men stopped short of crossing when the third ran across the road. He was struck by a 2006 GMC van hauling a trailer and boat.

The boy was transported to the Victoria County Memorial Hospital in Baddeck and then sent on to the Cape Breton Regional Hospital. He was listed as being in serious condition and undergoing tests and treatment for blunt trauma to his head area.

The vehicle and driver were from Ontario. Impairment and speed were not factors. Evidence on scene and witnesses confirm the youth had possibly not seen the east bound vehicle and ran out in front of it. The road was dry, the weather was clear and the area well lit from the lights of the gas station and street lights.

Wagmatcook

On July 16th, 2010, the Wagmatcook First Nation RCMP responded to a complaint of underage drinking. Upon arriving on scene, a young male was taken into police custody. He is facing charges of assaulting a police officer, resisting arrest and underage drinking.

Police were later called back to the same area in regards to a large fight involving approximately twenty people. A male was struck in the face and had to be taken to hospital. An automobile was heavily damaged by the out of control crowd. They smashed windows and struck the vehicle with bats. The vehicle was owned by a community elder. Police continue to investigate this matter.

During the early morning hours of July 17th, 2010, Wagmatcook RCMP members responded to a complaint regarding an intoxicated emotionally disturbed male who was attempting to commit suicide by walking into oncoming traffic. After a struggle with police, the male was taken into custody.
