

County players shine in NS Soccer League play

The MacDermid clan of North River continues to shine on the Provincial soccer scene as both Ben and Jessica led their respective teams to fine showings in the recent Nova Scotia Soccer League Senior play-offs.

For Ben and his Cape Breton Eastside Mario Selects the weekend of August 14th and 15th saw them drop a heartbreaking 3-2 decision to Suburban FC of Sackville in Semi-Final play with Ben continuing his season long scoring streak (he tied for the team lead) as he potted one of the Selects goals. Then in the League Consolation Match the Selects rebounded with a 4-3 victory over longtime Provincial powerhouse Dartmouth United in capturing 3rd place honors which was a tremendous success for the rebuilding Selects who only two years ago re-entered the Provincial circuit, a season that saw them win only one or two games in

total.

For Jessica the weekend was even more successful as she led her Cape Breton Selects to the League Final posting (she is the team goalkeeper) a 3-0 shut-out over Dartmouth United in one of Saturday's semi-finals. With the win the Selects earned the right to challenge Halifax Dunbrack in last Tuesday's League Championship Match where, despite Jessica's best efforts the Selects fell 3-1 to the Mainland squad. In fact so stellar was Jessica's play that *Chronicle Herald* reporter Monty Mosher had this to say in his write-up on the game, "Jill Lawrence had a chance to double the lead in the 31st minute with a clear run at the Cape Breton net, but MacDermid made her best stop to keep the spread at one. The speedy Huck ripped through the Cape Breton defence a few minutes later, leading to a two save sequence from MacDermid."
