The County's history through its buildings

The first designated building to house a high school for Victoria County was constructed in 1953 in the Village of Baddeck. Originally a structure on its own, over the years, it has been integrated into a single school complex now known as Baddeck Academy.

It is situated on the Shore Road with the Bras d'Or Lake in the background. It was built to serve the high school needs of some twenty-eight rural and village school sections within the county.

At the time of construction, the

physical plant which consisted of the buildings (school and bus garage), furniture, and equipment was provided by the Province of Nova Scotia. Initially, the school was administered by the School Board of Victoria County and the operation costs were shared on a seventy-five to twenty-five percent basis.

Designed to accommodate approximately two hundred students, it incorporated facilities for a broad and inclusive high school curriculum. It contained five academic classrooms, one of which doubled as the science laboratory. The auditorium/gymnasi-

um was centrally located in the school and it also served as the cafeteria. In addition to the above mentioned, there was a library, home economics and industrial arts departments, and a stage for school performances as well as providing an instructional area for the music department.

The Baddeck Rural High School opened its doors to students in September of 1953. The official opening took place later in the fall on Friday, 13th November with special guests in attendance in the persons of Hon. Angus L. MacDonald, Premier of Nova Scotia, Hon. Henry Hicks, Minister of Education, Hon. R.M. Fielding, Minister of Municipal Affairs, and Dr. C.L. MacMillan, MLA for Victoria County. Also taking part in the opening ceremonies was the warden of the county, A.E. MacLeod, Gordon S. Harvey, school board member, James MacKinnon, Inspector of Schools, and Charles W.K. McCurdy, secretary of the Victoria County School Board.

The first teaching staff were as follows: Gordon Hagen, Principal, Miss Christena Morrison, head teacher, Gerald Capstick, Mrs. Frieda Jones, Miss Elizabeth King, John MacLean, Mrs. Eveline MacLeod, Ronald MacPherson, and Stanton Sarty. The support staff were: Fred Robinson, caretaker, and school bus drivers, Douglas MacRae, supervisor, Hector MacRae, James "Jimmy King" MacLeod, and John W. MacFarlane.


