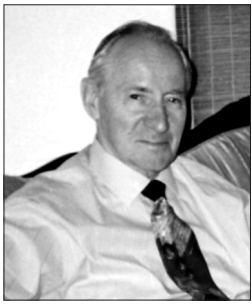


OBITUARIES
