The 30th Annual Cape Breton Regional Science Fair took place March 23rd and 24th and Baddeck Academy students fared very well.

Drew Stonehouse (Grade 7) was awarded a cash prize of \$100 for his outstanding project related to physical sci-

ence sponsored by the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council. His project compared white hockey stick tape to black hockey stick tape which he entitled *He Tapes, He Scores*.

Caleb MacCormack (Grade 7) won the Engineering Award and received a \$100 cash prize from Innovacorp and

\$50 honourable mention in the Junior Division for his project which measured the strengths of various species of wood, entitled *Would You Want This Wood?*

Bailey Chapman (Grade 12) was awarded a \$500 Health Research bursary from Cape Breton University for her project which she called "AMAZEing Genetics".

Taylor Pierrard (Grade 12) was awarded a \$1,000 entrance scholarship to Nova Scotia Agricultural College for her project entitled *Equestrian Motion*.

Grade 12 student Kendra MacCus-

pic's project entitled *Liberation Determination* was awarded the Silver Medal and a cash award of \$150 from Cape Breton University as well as a \$1,000 renewable scholarship amounting to \$4,000 to Mount Allison University.

Kendra was also one of the four students chosen to represent Northside Victoria Regional School Board at the Canada wide science fair to be held in Toronto in May. As a member of the Nova Scotia Team Kendra will be attending the Nova Scotia Showcase, a three day event held at the end of April in Halifax.
