

Increased rates for new ground water system

pipelines to bring the water into the Village at a yet to be determined cost.

Project Manager for the water project is Andrew McIntosh from CBCL. He said, "The next steps are to go out for design engineering of the well field. We are also in the process of developing the time lines for the project."

Mr. Keeling said the rate increases are to help cover the costs of the new water source project.

The Village is utilizing infrastructure money from the Build Canada Fund.

For residential customers (5/8" meters), the current average quarterly water bill, based upon quarterly consumption of 36 cubic metres per quarter, is \$48.49 and it is proposed to decrease to \$48.09 (a 0.8% decrease) in 2011/12; \$55.57 (a 15.6% increase) in 2012/13; and \$65.50 (a 17.9% increase) in 2013/14. The 36 cubic metres per quarter is based upon

the average consumption of all residential customers, including seasonal customers. The actual proposed rates for an individual resident will differ from those stated above, depending upon individual consumption.

For all other metered services, the Utility is requesting amendments ranging from -4.7% to 10.2% in 2011/12; 16.8% to 26.9% in 2012/13; and 8.2% to 17.5% in 2013/14.

The annual fire protection charge paid by the Village of Baddeck and the Municipality of the County of Victoria, currently \$53,316 is proposed to decrease to \$37,833 (a 29.0% decrease) for 2011/12; increase to \$43,650 (a 15.4% increase) in 2012/13; and \$64,708 (a 48.2% increase) in 2013/14.

Upon reviewing the Application, the Board, in its decision, may determine that the proposed amendments should be as requested, or higher, or lower.
