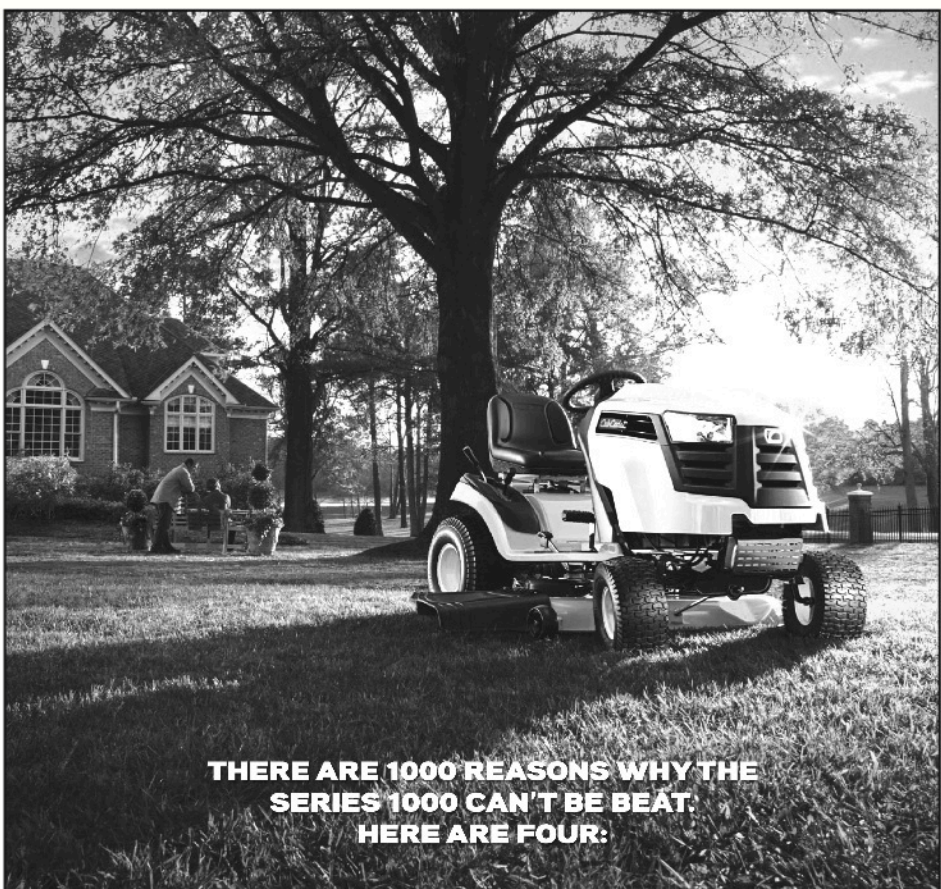

"Those engaging in the distribution and making of child pornography sometimes believe the anonymity of the Internet means they are safe from apprehension. Fortunately, this is not the case and police are actively looking for people who are committing these criminal acts against the most vulnerable in our society, our children."

Archibald turned himself into Ingonish RCMP Detachment Thursday, May 19th, 2011 and appeared in Sydney Provincial Court at 9:30 a.m. to enter a

plea.

The investigation is ongoing which is national and international in scope, however, no additional charges are expected against Archibald at this time.

The ICE Unit investigates individuals who victimize children by accessing, making, possessing and/or distributing Child Pornography and investigates the luring of children over the internet for a sexual purpose. Citizens are encouraged to call RCMP, local police or Crime stoppers with any knowledge of child abuse or criminal activity occurring in the community.

secondary school studies.

The consensus from Council and the gallery was that busing students elsewhere to take courses not offered locally is unacceptable.

Mr. Green maintained that it was the only economically feasible way to offer those courses

Mr. Green admitted the renovation project was underfunded from the beginning.

"The project was allocated funds in 2007," he said. "And those dollars don't go as far today."

Warden Morrison added that a limited number high school courses will not attract new families to the area. "Development depends on accessible health care and education," he said. "Take away one or the other and our chances of growth are very much

diminished."

In a press release MLA Bain said, "I'm not sure why there has been such a breakdown in communication between the parties involved but the community deserves to know the future of their school and their children's education."

Lynn Myers Chair of the Baddeck Academy School Advisory Committee said that including two more classrooms and a drama room which could double as a classroom should fill the students needs.

Since March, plans for the school renovation project have been cut back significantly to allow for more thorough updates to the elementary wing, leaving the school short at least three learning spaces.

Mr. Green said the only way to break the impasse is for the Province to give in.
