with five full time fishers from Wagmatcook working in Pubnico. Its 55' vessel is fishing full-time with the size of its sizeable groundfish quota while its lobster and snow crab licences are scattered around Cape

Breton and the Mainland.

Last year the fishers saw the need for and opportunity to partner with Nova's Finest in Pubnico to build an ice plant to meet their needs. The business plan became operational and has proven to be a success.

"The key to Wagmatcook's future is good planning," Chief Bernard said.

Mr. Arbutnot added, "It is important to know that these enterprises are not being totally subsidized by the government. The community is, through its various operations managers, proving to be fiscally responsible and re-investing back into the community."

Chief Bernard is pleased with the new confidence and cooperative spirit being exhibited within the community.

"With proper planning we can accomplish great things," he said.
