Paramedics to sponsor benefit for Lifeflight helipad upgrade

Each County in Nova Scotia is responsible for the upgrading and maintenance of its own landing area for emergency helicopters. All provincial landing zones are funded through community fundraising and donations.

The paramedics of Baddeck would like to sponsor a Benefit Dance to raise funds to improve the existing helipad for emergency landings.

Gerald Dunlop, Supervisor at the Baddeck EMC, said, "We feel this landing pad would be very beneficial to the residents of Baddeck and surrounding communities, bringing faster accessibility to the Regional trauma center in Sydney and the Provincial trauma center in Halifax."

The Department of Natural Resources has seen the urgency of the situation and has given permission to proceed with repairs to the existing helipad. They have also cleared brush and debris from the area doing as much work as they could to prepare the area to meet EHS lifeflight specifications. The cost of upgrade will be between \$6,500 and \$7,500 with help from a local contractor who has given an excellent price to carry out the work.

At the present time, the EHS lifeflight helicopter cannot land in Baddeck and all emergencies must be transported to Sydney or Port Hawkesbury prior to meeting with the helicopter. This means further medical assistance may be delayed by a considerable amount of time

The Baddeck Volunteer Fire Department has donated the Community Hall for a fundraising Benefit Dance on April 23, 201µl with music by Tylor MacCuspic, Disc Jockey, with all proceeds from the event going toward the lifeflight helipad.

"We look forward to this community event and appreciate the support of everyone in Victoria County, said Mr. Dunlop."
