Coming up in August at Baddeck Library, it's the "Docs and Talks" Documentary and Discussion series. Join us for a short NFB documentary followed by lively, moderated discussions. On August 2, we're showing "Me and the Mosque" - a look at women in Islam and the debate over equal access for women in Canadian mosques. On August 16, it's "Almost Real" - a film that introduces people using the Internet to connect with others in surprising ways. Baddeck's Summer Welcome Program Series continues every Thursday night in August, and it's a great chance to come out and learn about Cape Breton's cultural and heritage traditions. On August 4, join Sean Dunlap for a presentation about the building of the Transatlantic Cable. On August 11, Jocelyn Bethune of the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site presents a talk about Mabel Bell. On August 18, Otis Tomas will share the story behind his newly-published book, "The Fiddle Tree." And on August 25, members of the Middle River Historical Society will present tales from days gone by. All programs begin at 6:30 p.m., are free of charge, and include tea and oatcakes. Residents and summer visitors are welcome!

Also in August, children enrolled in the Summer Reading Program can participate in Games Day - a fun program based on our Summer Reading theme, "Splash". Ingonish Library's Games Day is August 10 from 1-2:30 pm, and Baddeck Library's Games Day is August 12 from 10:30 - 11:30 am. Please call your local branch to register for this free program.

Teens are on the agenda in August, as well. On August 10 from 6-8 pm, Baddeck Library is hosting a Teen Games night with Wii, board games, snacks, and more. And on August 16 and 18 from 10 am-12, high school students and youth headed for university are invited to take advantage of a free University Writing Workshop at the library. Under the Recreation Facility Development Program, the grants will be used to renovate facilities, develop and maintain walking trails, and build and upgrade various fields and buildings used for sport and recreation.

The Neil's Harbour/New Haven Development Association have also been a partner in building and providing a comfort station in cooperation with Enterprise Cape Breton Corporation, the County of Victoria and the Cabot Trail Working Association. This project is now complete and offers a laundromat and a shower for travellers through the area.

The Recreation Facility Development Program helps community groups, municipalities and other not-for-profit organizations develop facilities to increase public participation in sport and physical recreation.
