For my last article on heritage buildings, I wrote about the J.P. MacLeod & Sons general stores which operated over a ninety year time span between 1874 and 1964 and were located on the main street in Baddeck.

As a follow up to that article, I am featuring one of the dwellings owned and occupied by the MacLeod family.

This house was built in 1890 (circa) and was initially owned by John P. Sr. Later, it became the residence of John P. Jr. and his wife, Catherine. The property

Pictured in the older photograph were members of the family, namely,


Malcolm MacLeod (son of John P. Sr.), his wife Mabel and their two sons, Jack and Walter (held by his mother) and their dog.

Garbage Shipped to Guysborough

For the month of August, 2011, 381.46 Tonnes of garbage were shipped bringing the total to 16,134.68 Tonnes

Organic Materials Collected

For the month of August, 2011, 17.55 Tonnes of organics were collected bringing the total to 916.00 Tonnes
