Choir: Singing Director, Adrianne Chapman and Board Chair, Ian Green have been hard at work to set up a joint adult and children Choir in the north of Smokey area. First rehearsal will be January 16th with 16 sessions planned and final performances around the Easter time. TOTH received provincial funding to set to music a choral piece by acclaimed Nova Scotia composer Scott Macmillan which will be part of the spring performance. Green said that Theatre on the Hill has dreamed of a choir since the days of the musical "Oliver" (2005) and now with funding from the Municipality of Victoria County, Pepsi Co and the Victoria County Community Health Board this has become a reality. Due to this financial support TOTH can continue to offer these programs at no cost to the participant a core mandate of the organization.

Bursary: Kathryn Bridgland is the recipient of the first ever Theatre on the Hill Triple Sensation Bursary. Fundraisers were held throughout the past two

years to raise the \$1500 that was the financial goal of the organization. Residents north of Smokey were invited to submit applications for the bursary with the main criteria being the recipient pursue their interest and love of the performing arts. This could have taken many forms, not necessarily formal education. Kathryn is studying Technical Theatre Studies at Dalhousie in Halifax. She is the daughter of Ruth McLagan and James Bridgland. All three of them have been involved with Theatre on the Hill for many years.


