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

Cape North weather exhibit

The device in the foreground is a replica of a "fog cannon" found near Louisbourg in the 1830s. It is on loan to the Museum by the Fortress of Louisbourg. The cannon is believed to have been used in the 16th and 17th centuries by Portuguese mariners in Cape Breton waters. When enveloped in fog, a round would be fired, and the crew would listen for the echo. By timing the interval, the crew could estimate the distance to the nearest large obstruction, such as a cliff. The Museum, including the weather exhibit, is open daily from 10 to 4, until mid-October.

Cape North
The North Highlands Community Museum has put the final touches on an exhibit about Cape Breton weather. Called "Cape Breton Weather, Cape Breton Lives," the exhibit explores some of the many ways in which weather and climate have shaped the settlement and development of Cape Breton and have inspired poets, painters and photographers.

The exhibit has been developed under the direction of Museum volunteer Bill Danielson, a retired meteorologist and author of *Cape Breton Weather Watching for the Naturally Curious*. (CBU Press). The exhibit is unique in that it is the only one in Nova Scotia devoted to specifically to weather.

Professor Danielson has constructed the exhibit from numerous photographs, stories and recollections provided by many Cape Bretoners, and from a wide range of written material. Crucial to this effort has been access to all issues of *Cape Breton Magazine*, published by Ronald Caplan, which are now available on the Internet and can be searched by topic, location, and other means.

The exhibit's grand opening was on Sunday, July 10 at 2 p.m., at the Museum's Culture Centre (the former Cape North United Church) immediately adjacent to the museum on the Cabot Trail in Cape North Village. CBC Cape Breton's *Information Morning* Host Steve Sutherland and Mr. Danielson made brief remarks, followed by the official opening for viewing.

Weather-related activities such as constructing simple barometers, and weather-related refreshments such as slushies were among some of the afternoon's attractions.

The exhibit can be seen daily during the Museum's regular hours, which are daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., until mid-October. The Museum wishes to acknowledge the financial support of Enterprise Cape Breton Corporation (ECBC) for marketing and other aspects of this project.
