20% of what it gives to industry for job creation and give it to the arts and culture sector. "This would be an infusion of close to \$100 million," he suggested. "\$100 million a year for the next decade would put Nova Scotia in the forefront worldwide."

Other suggestions included:

- the re-creation of an arms length Arts Council which would administer the funding.
- a policy change that would include equitable arts education across the province.
- money for capital infrastructure should have an arts and/or culture component

so that publicly funded projects would contain an agreement to purchase and display Nova Scotia art.

 ensure that the relationship between the sector stakeholders and the government be arms length, transparent and well funded to be recognized internationally.

With such changes, the artists believe that in 5 years the success of the arts and culture sector would be evident in more art being produced, the cultural community expanding with increased income levels and wide international recognition.

The public consultations closed on October 12th.
